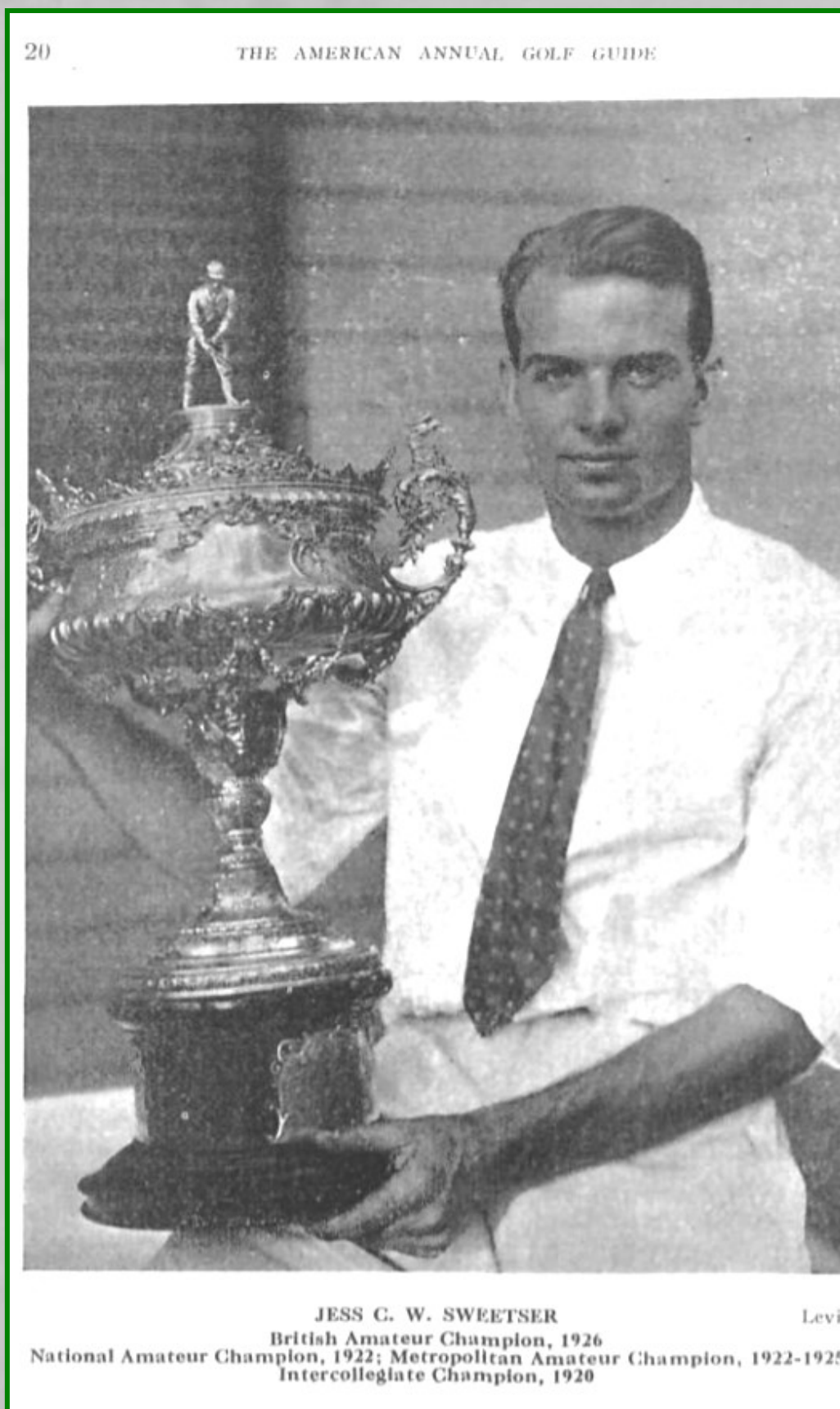

VALLEY CLUB PLANS CHANGE

Tenth Hole To Be Added At Green Spring Golf Course

The nine-hole golf course at the Green Spring Valley Hunt Club is undergoing reconstruction and eventually, it is believed, will become a regular orthodox layout. The organization is in a position to acquire the requisite real estate to enlarge the present course.

This proposed change, however, is not definite, but plans already have been made for an additional hole for this year, which will make ten holes for play.

Survey Completed

The golf committee, which is composed of R. H. Read, chairman; Herman Stump, C. R. Roland, H. C. Thompson and Francis Barker, has had a survey made by Herbert Strong, nationally-known golf architect, whose work is well known to Maryland golfers.

Plans call for the first and tenth holes, new ones, to be located on the clubhouse lawn. The old fourth hole will be abandoned. Three holes were rebuilt last year and the finishing touches are being put on the ninth. Models for the new greens will be received by the committee within a few days.

New Caddy Quarters

The decision to arrange part of the golf course this year also means other alterations. John C. Thomas, president of the club, stated yesterday. The old caddy house at the first hole also will be abandoned.

New caddy clubhouse quarters for Leo Kernan, the golf pro, will be established beneath the porch of the clubhouse.

IT has been demonstrated over a series of years that the United States Amateur golfers can present for the Walker Cup matches too strong a front for the British to cope with. The overwhelming victories of the Americans by eleven matches to one in the foursomes to produce his best or even his normal score. Jones, of course, is the genius of the game, but the scores which he has compiled against opponents in the 36-hole matches of the last two Amateur championships exaggerate the edge he really has on the field.
